Increase the number of pupils engaged in regular physical activity and healthy lifestyles; raise the profile of PE and sport across the school, as a tool for whole school improvement; continue to increase the confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport to ensure challenge and achievement for all pupils and increase the range of sports and activities offered to all pupils; increase participation in competitive sport, ensure teaching is skills focused as opposed to games.

Our objectives include:

Engaging all children in activity; raising the awareness of healthy lifestyles and the impact on lives; raising confidence and enjoyment of activity to promote active healthy lives; ensuring staff confidence and abilities are up to date; children to recognise the importance of active and healthy lifestyles, increasing physical well-being, ensuring children have the opportunity to compete in competitive activity. Continue to develop the sustainability of the subject across the school.

Impact:

Ensuring all teachers are teaching specific skills to a high standard; ensure all teachers are following the scheme of work; ensure children are fully engaged in physical activity throughout lessons; ensure children are able to discuss what they are learning, why and its impact.
